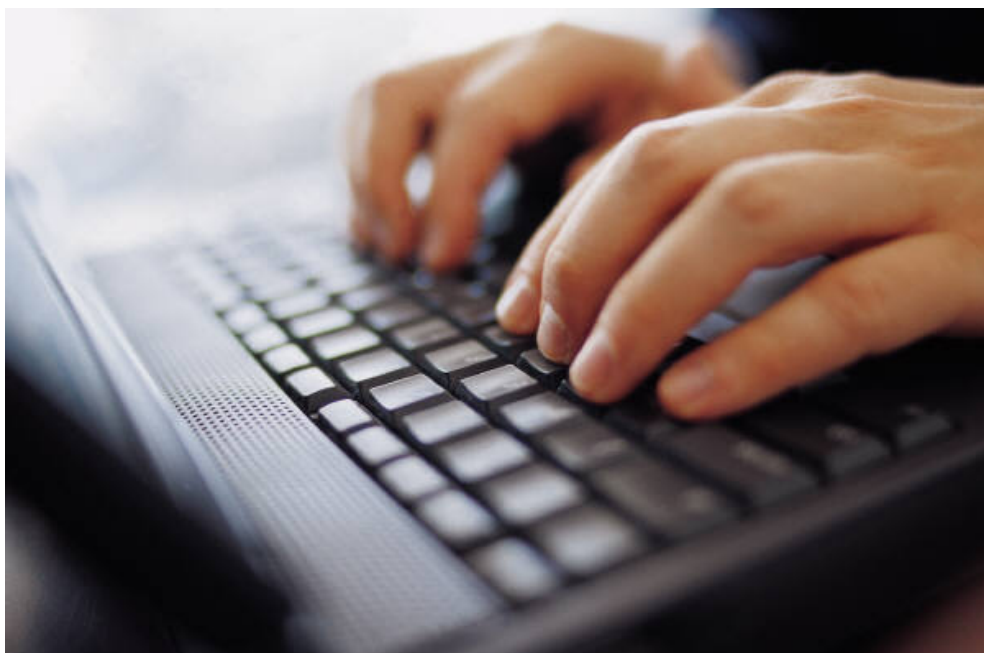

Through Technology Fees paid by students and supplemental grants from the Department of Agricultural Economics and the College of Agricultural Sciences and Natural Resources (CASNR), Room 226 in Morgan Hall was further upgraded to more of a SMART classroom with the addition of 40 laptop computers and a symposium.

The Ag Finance class was the first course to be adapted to make full use of the available facilities. Dr. Riley will share his experiences in using the equipment directly in classroom lectures and demonstrate some of the capabilities of the equipment.

The objective of the seminar and demonstration will be to encourage other faculty to make use of the equipment to facilitate and enhance their teaching as well as the learning of the students.
